

## **YMCA Camp Pinewood COVID-19 Requirements**

### **Before your event**

The Group Leader must perform a health screening of all group participants *before* arriving on the camp property. The health screening includes the following questions and will require that individuals who display symptoms associated with COVID-19 not attend camp. If guests leave camp due to COVID-19 symptoms, the Camp Director must be notified immediately.

- All group participants will be asked the following questions. If the answer is 'yes' to any of the below questions, the group participant will not be allowed in camp. These questions should not be recorded or written down anywhere.
  - Have you or anyone in your household experienced any of the following symptoms: fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, or loss of taste or smell in the last 14 days?
  - Have you or anyone in your household displayed any symptoms of COVID-19 in the last 14 days?
  - To the best of your knowledge, has anyone in your household come into close contact with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 14 days?
  - Have you or anyone in your household traveled outside of the US in the last 14 days?
  - Have you or anyone in your household traveled out of the state recently?

The Group Leader is responsible for communicating the following procedures and ensuring that members of his/her group abide to all procedures during your event at Camp Pinewood:

- Events with group members of separate households are limited to 10 participants per cabin/lodge.
- Participants will be asked to sign a waiver acknowledging the risk of COVID-19 and camp programming.
- Guests are encouraged to practice social distancing and self-monitoring 2 weeks prior to their visit.
- Initial health screenings will be performed before guests enter the camp grounds or buildings including a temperature check.
- Guests with a high risk of complications from COVID-19 infection, or who are living with a high risk individual are recommended to not attend camp. Consult your physician with questions.
- Each guest should have twice daily temperature and symptoms checks.
- Anyone on site that exhibits COVID-19 symptoms or has a fever of over 100.4 F will be quarantined on camp until they can depart safely.
- Guests and staff should practice social distancing as much as possible. Many activities will need to be done in smaller groups.
- Masks must be worn at all times when indoors (with exceptions made for eating) and when outside and participants are unable to socially distance.

### **During your event**

Upon arrival to Camp Pinewood, all guests agree to an arrival screening that includes a temperature check upon check-in. Camp Directors will require that individuals who display symptoms associated with COVID-19 not attend camp. If guests leave camp due to COVID-19 symptoms, the Camp Director must be notified immediately.

- Temperature must be below 100.4 degrees
  - Individuals' temperatures will be taken upon arrival. Anyone with a temperature at 100.4 or above will be asked to return to their cars immediately.
- The Camp Director will collect signed waivers for all guests that are attending camp from the Group Leader.
- It is recommended that the Group Leaders check all attendees' temperatures twice a day. Temperature readings at or above 100.4 degrees should be reported to the Camp Director immediately.
- Guests are encouraged to bring their own bottle(s) of hand sanitizer and bottled water.
- Masks must be worn at all times when indoors (with exceptions made for eating) and when outside and participants are unable to socially distance. Groups composed of members entirely of a single household are not required to wear masks while inside their rented unit.
- Guest groups with members of separate households must maintain a minimum distance of 6ft at all times.
- Butler Lodge Dining Hall is the only room allowing more than ten people (up to 60). Social distance rules must be maintained, and masks must be worn unless eating. Accommodations may be made for staggered use of communal buildings.
- Guests may not enter cabins other than their own designated sleeping cabin.
- Guests and staff should practice social distancing as much as possible. Staff will not enter your rental unit with the exception of providing necessary maintenance. Please notify staff for trash removal.
- With the exception of the designated rental space, all other camp buildings are off limits without prior approval.
- For units with kitchens, guests are encouraged to bring disposable dishware. Any dishware belonging to Pinewood must be washed prior to checkout, and left on counter space for further cleaning by camp staff.
- It is recommended that guests maintain separate rooms for sleeping. If rooms are shared, it is recommended that guests sleep in beds at least six feet apart. Sleeping head to toe, and using alternating bunk heights is strongly encouraged.

Please complete the health screening for your group participants (children and any adults attending), sign, date, and return this signed form to the Camp Director upon your arrival to YMCA Camp Pinewood.

**The Group Leader verifies that all participants due to arrive at YMCA Camp Pinewood at the agreed upon date per the signed User Group Agreement have answered the screening questions re: COVID-19 indicating that they are not at greater risk for contracting COVID-19. The group leader also acknowledges that guests refusing to adhere to these guidelines may be asked to leave camp without a refund.**
